Did you know FamilySearch can find similar records?

A FamilySearch feature, called *Similar Records*, may help in the record searching process. Its purpose is to help you find additional records that may belong to your ancestor.

From your ancestor's person page under *Search Records*, select *FamilySearch*. When the search results come up click on *View Record Details*.



On the right-hand side of the record details page, find *Similar Records*. Some of these sources may already be attached to your ancestor but there can be new sources you are not aware of.

There's always the chance that a source is attached to someone who is a duplicate of your ancestor, so this is another way of finding duplicates.

This feature can also be accessed when you open up a source from *Sources* on the person page. Click to open the source. *Similar Records* are found in the bottom right.

It might be a good idea to always look for similar records when you are looking at a source attached to an ancestor. You never know what you will find!
